



When I consider the contribution of some great Welsh breeders over the last 40 years I am very proud to be the first National Chairman from the region and will endeavour to fully vindicate your support.

I would thank my predecessor David Mawhinney for his hard work over his period of office and his personal support in ensuring my smooth transition to succession. I would also thank his fellow directors for ensuring the continuing financial stability of the Society and over the past year I have been massively impressed at Council and F&GP meetings by the diligence that they scrutinise and continually endeavour to implement improvements to society business.

The year started off with a bang at the AGM held at Belfast in Northern Ireland. Socially we have always been a welcoming Society and it was a great turnout of members who greatly appreciated the hospitality and entertainment from a thriving well run region.

Chairmans Report ARWYN THOMAS



The sale highlight annually is the Worcester Premier and this year did not disappoint with Knockin Shockin eclipsing the breed record in selling for 25,000 gns. Equally pleasing was the overall 90% clearance rate that shows a strong demand for the quality sires on offer throughout the sale. The celebration female sale on the Friday evening was also a great success with the top price of 3,000 gns rewarding the long journey from N Ireland for the Ringclare flock.

Going forward Council recognise the need to regenerate the Society ram sales with improved promotion.
Surveys have shown that buyers recognise the strength of our breed with easy lambing, tremendous vigour at birth and fantastic growth rates but equally show that we have not been successful in communicating to the commercial buyer that the breed has developed far greater hardiness over the last few years.

This has not happened by accident but has been addressed by breeders over the last 10 years targeting hardier characteristics in breeding stock to overcome this perceived disadvantage against competitors.

Pedigree Sales have gone really well last year particularly with strong prices at the end of season female sales but the target going forward is to reward all breeders for their efforts by improving our commercial ram sales.

To enforce this message and eventually expand our market share of ram sales we have recently appointed Emma Mellen as a Breed Development and Promotion Officer. I am excited by her appointment and I am positive it is a step in the right direction.

Breed promotion is vital and I thank all the showmen at our Major Royal /County shows for presenting outstanding quality in this free shop window. Winning is nice but it is the free promotion for all that is important. To this end I would also thank all those new members who start out at the local village shows as these venues are again great shop windows in enticing new buyers to our breed.

At the time of this article it is great to see Charollais topping cull ewe prices nationally and with new season Charollais lambs fetching premium prices I am optimistic for the coming year but let us not be complacent but strive collectively as members to take the breed forward.

Pedigree Charollais Vital to Prime lamb Business

Although John Parry's land rises to 457 metres (1,500 feet), he has opted to use Charollais rams on his Welsh Mules since the 1990s.

Having recently changed his sheep strategy and switching to only producing finished lambs rather than lambs and replacement ewes, the Charollais breed is set to play an increasing role on-farm.

In the process of selling his 400

head Welsh hill flock previously used for the production of Welsh Mules, Mr Parry now hopes to run solely Mules, which he says will simplify the system and means he no longer needs to manage different groups of sheep.

With additional ground rented a few miles from the family home of Goitre Farm, Kerry, Montgomeryshire, Mr Parry is aiming to produce more kilos of lamb per hectare, rather than carrying additional breeding stock. Considering the rent, labour and additional costs required in producing ewes, Mr Parry is now set to buy his Mules, which he believes will be more fruitful

He says "I want my land to work for me and I think producing more lambs is the answer".

Owning 134ha (330 acres) and renting 61ha (150 acres), all Mules are bought as yearlings from Society sales and put to Charollais rams. He favours the white-faced Mule as he says they are hardier and keep their condition better.

HUNGRY

Preferring them 'clean faced' he opts for the 'second sized' ewes in sales, saying the bigger ones are 'too hungry' for him.

Believing an extra year of production can be had from white-faced Welsh Mules, he says they are not quite so milky and less susceptible to mastitis as a result

Mr Parry's time with the Charollais breed started with Texel cross Charollais rams in

the early 1990s as he switched to finishing lambs earlier. The breed was said to finish lambs sooner than the Suffolk and Texel rams they were using at the time.

He says "I buy tups from the National Sheep Association sale at Builth and I tend to think if they start with a good shoulder, everything else will follow".

"In my experience, Charollais tups are also good on their feet. The breed has changed over the years and the rams have got hardier. Longevity has always been a problem for commercial farmers as it is not often the breeders' priority when it comes to pedigree stock, and Charollais were no different."

Although these rams are being used for finished lambs, Mr Parry is keen to stick to pedigree on the paternal side, saying he wants to use rams which are true to type.

Lambing starts in the last week of February with a batch of 450 lambed inside. Teaser rams are used so 90 per cent of lambs are born within 10 days, while the second batch of ewes start in mid-March.

Mr Parry says "The Charollais

gives strong lambs at birth which are quick to be up and sucking. The Welsh Mule is a cracking mother and a good versatile ewe."

Once lambed, everything goes into individual pens for the first six to 12 hours of life and then to a communal pen for 24 hours before being turned out.

VERSATILE

During lambing time Mr Parry's wife Kate, who is also a small animal vet at Hafren Veterinary Group, Newtown, does the early morning lambing. They have help

for six to eight weeks in lambing season and new workman Trevor Coach will also be on hand to help this year.

Mr Parry says "We might use rain jackets for the lambs but not as much as they once did due to the improvement of the breed. But the fragility of lambs can be due to the quality of milk received as much as the breeding. Charollais rams are hardier and pass this trait on to their lambs."

Ewes are taken inside prelambing and Mr Parry says he is not afraid to do so up to 10

A 12 metre (40ft) wide grass silage pit is used in a self-feeding system, which Mr Parry says is a low-labour method, and a high protein blend is fed in the last three weeks pre-lambing.

He says "Everything has to come home to lamb, so at that point we are running 900 ewes on 67ha. Sheep do not go away for winter keep so they need to spend that period housed.

"We scan at more than 200 per cent with a barren rate of less than 2 per cent and a twin rate of 60 per cent. I would not want to scan at any less than 195 per cent as numbers sold are just not high enough."

Early lambs are fed concentrate and sold off their mothers, taken to a deadweight of 20kg. Those off later lambing ewes are weaned and finished on grass for a 21kg carcase. Tup lambs are left entire.

Generally, 99 per cent of lambs have left the farm by the beginning of November and they go through 2 Sisters at Merthyr Tydfil, with Mr Parry favouring selling deadweight as he

appreciates the feedback he receives on his carcases.

A 2 Sisters collection centre has also been staged at Goitre Farm for the past 10 years.

Mr Parry says "Every farm needs an alternative source of income. It is no longer just the small farms."

Orkney may suffer from its geographical location, with some of the harshest weather and long winters, but there is one thing for certain, some of the country's best stockmen and livestock can be found on the island.

One of Scotland's finest Charollais sheep flocks is found on the island, run by Sheena Coghill together with her husband Terry and son Lee on 400 acres between their two units, Muce and Newbigging with an additional 150 acres of rented ground.

The family run a spring-calving 135 suckler cow herd, made up of predominantly Limousin cross cows which have most recently been bulled to the Charolais and the Salers to produce good, hardy and milky replacements and progeny which are either sold as stores or finished.

On the pedigree side the Coghills run a few Limousin and Charolais

females alongside the main suckler herd to produce breeding bulls which are sold direct to farmers on the island. Notably, some of these Coghill-bred bulls have gone on to produce some of the best Genomic Estimate Breeding Values for customers which have finished calves.

HEKRA AT KELSO RAM SALES


As well as maintaining a profitable cattle enterprise Sheena's well-known Hekra Charollais sheep flock is proving to be just as successful, producing quality commercial shearlings each year for the Kelso Ram Sales, where they have been in the top five for averages in the last few years and have reached a healthy £1,200. The

flock attracts repeat business each year, with some tups travelling as far as Suffolk for one large commercial flock.

These shearlings certainly pay their way as Sheena has never used hopper feeders and they're on grass right up until sale time. They do, however, receive a little feeding before being transported as Sheena finds the long trip down to Kelso takes a toll on them

"The Charollais is an easy lambing and low maintenance breed which can survive some of the roughest days here in Orkney," said Sheena, who founded her flock in 1994 with an importation from France and other females from Auchenlay, Breck and Cairnhill flocks.

"When we previously ran a commercial flock, the Charollais always outweighed everything else and the Charollais cross lambs were always the heaviest.

TOP GROWTH RATES

Charollais tups do well crossed with any breed of ewe as in the past I've tupped them to Suffolk ewes and that cross worked well, producing good, growth lambs," said Sheena, who added that the bottom end of Charollais females are tupped to a Texel to produce cross shearlings for Kelso.

With lambing commencing indoors at the end of January, an 18% protein nut is normally introduced just two weeks before lambs are due and hay is only added if there has been snow.

For ease of management and considering the island's unpredictable climate the last two years' weaning process has taken place in May before the ewes and lambs head outside. In contrast, ewe lambs are either kept on as replacements or sold privately, while cross ewe lambs are sold privately off the island.

TOP SIRES IN THE FLOCK

Sheena and Terry are regular visitors to the breed Premier Sale at Worcester to pick out new stock rams for their flock. They are not scared to bid for the sheep they feel will bring the right genetic traits to the flock. Last year they paid 1,100 gns for Logie Durno Sargent and 1,000 gns for Loanhead Single Malt both from the Ingram family in Aberdeenshire.

Single Malt looked good value as he was sired by top performance sire, Wedderburn Peleus and his dam was a daughter of multi-winning show ewe, Logie Durno Kate. "He is leaving lambs with a bit of size and style," reports Sheena. "We sold all the gimmers in lamb to Sargent, so will have to wait to see what his progeny are going to be like."

"I did fancy some other ram lambs and a shearling but the wealthy Irishmen outbid me. I remember this happening to me years ago when I tried to buy Foulrice Danny Boy in Lanark!" One of the most influential sires of the past few year has been Logie Durno Outlander a son of Riverdale Nobel out of a Crogham Hannibal II ewe. L D Outlander was purchased at Worcester as a shearling in 2016 for 800gns.

Other tups that have done well in the flock were a Cannahars tup. also a son of Cairnhill Cavalier from the Southam flock and Parkaate Grandmaster from Herbie Kennedy. "We purchased Carthorpe Gaberdeen privately from Ralph Alderson's flock in Yorkshire and he did well for me leaving some nice females and a very good homebred tup Hekra Kingpin."

SHOW SUCCESS

There's been plenty of show success for Sheena, too, as last year at Dounby show Logie Durno Outlander was champion in the Charollais classes and went on to win the Interbreed Title. Also

At the County Show it was a ewe that took the Charollais championship; she was double homebred being out of Hekra Kingpin and a home-bred ewe. Reserve to her was a ewe lamb out of Outlander and a ewe by Highway Leigh Halfpenny.

"It is my two daughters who help most with the sheep. Leona the youngest takes a very active roll in helping with dressing etc and takes a big interest in breeding. She enjoyed her trip to Worcester with us in 2016 and to meet more of the Charollais Breeders and was interested in picking out a new stock ram."


FLOCK COMPETITIONS

The Hekra flock has been hugely succesful in the Flock competition for the North of Scotland, winning the overall title no fewer than 6 times and being runner-up twice. In the first National Flock Competition ran in 2003 the flock was overall runner-up.

EXPORT

Certainly the most northerly Charollais flock in the UK attracted interest from overseas as Sheena sold two tup lambs and a shearling to a breeder in Germany in 2017. "This year we will have a number of Charollais gimmers for sale again as they seem to be dominating the sexes in the flock over the past few years."

Needless to say, there's never a dull moment for this farming family, but with superior stockmanship and a constant eye on what is an ever-changing market and climate you can rest assured the Coghills always aim to achieve the best results for their business.




SCRAPIE

UK Charollais breeders have for decades been selecting stock on their ability to be resistant to scrapie. This procedure has been possible by the analysis of DNA from our sheep.

Figures from our data base show that 91% of Charollais are now ARR/ARR genotype. Add to that figure the 8.4% that are ARR/ARQ and it means that our whole breed can be guaranteed not to suffer from this disease, 96% of reaistered stock rams are ARR/ARR. Very soon we will be moving to 100% resistant animals in our flock book; a claim which no other breed can match.

So what benefits does this give the Charollais breed? Well apart from the obvious disease eradication there are other advantages of having this enhanced profile over other terminal sire breeds.

Charollais Rams have a high health status and are structually suitable for a long and productive life.

UK Charollais genetics have been exported around the globe and this market will continue as emerging markets seek out better quality meat products. A requirement on all export certificates is a level of resistance to scrapie.

In terms of the export of lamb meat from the UK, as we seek out new markets post Brexit some of these ie China will demand a higher level of health checks and scrapie will very much be a part of this. TSE rules still stop us accessing the US market. It may well come that carcases will have to be sired by scrapie resistant rams and the Charollais breed can offer commercial lamb producers the widest selection of tups with this added guarantee.

MAEDI VISNA

Speak to any vet practice up and down the country and they will tell you of the increasing incidence of clinical cases of Maedi Visna (MV) in commercial ewe flocks.

MV is a chronic disease of sheep caused by a retrovirus. The main clinical signs are of pneumonia and wasting. The condition is highly contagious, difficult to diagnose and is fatal.

As Charollais breeders we believe that sheep should be able to walk, run, graze, breath, survive and have a long and healthy life. To achieve this they need to be structurally sound. That means good feet and legs, correct mouths and no genetic faults. Excessive muscling does not allow for free,

active movement. To this end we inspect our sheep rigorously at sales for correctness, explain to our judges how to select for these traits and encourage our breeders to cull out anything that is substandard.

ACTIVE WORKERS

We are confident that when you purchase Charollais rams they will be active workers and last for many years. Therefore they are a sound economic investment, cutting back the cost of the ram for each lamb born.

A recent survey amongst commercial ram users found that they expected their rams to last 4+ years. The most common causes of loss recorded in the survey (which was not breed specific) were respiratory diseases and lameness. Both these problems can be caused by a genetic weakness,

prevalent in some other terminal sire breeds.

HEALTH TREATMENT RECORDS

Good husbandry in terms of vaccination programmes is also essential for ram longevity and we encourage our breeders to follow such programmes and also to pass onto buyers a clear record of treatments.

To quote Brutus from
Shakespeare's play Julius Caesar,
"There is a tide in the affairs of
men, which taken at the flood,
leads on to fortune" and Alex
Crossley of Greenwood Farm,
Burton, on the Wirral peninsula
certainly has to rely on the tide
and performance recorded
Charollais sheep for the
profitability of his sheep
enterprise.

With a wry smile when asked how many acres he farms he retorts "it depends whether the tide is in or out" The farm comprises of 340 acres of permanent grassland, 60 acres of arable land used for growing spring Barley and stubble Turnips and 2,600 acres of saltmarsh on the eastern side of the Dee Estuary. This family farm is part owned and part tenanted with three different landlords, the Ministry of Defence, the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds and Tata. The vegetation on the salt marshes comprises of fescues and salt tolerant plants such as Samphire, sea purslane and Sparta grasses.

The "Parkgate Saltmarsh" is designated as a SSSI and SPA for its winter wildfowl and wading bird numbers, and the saltmarsh is a designated SAC for the special plant groupings that grow there. Throughout the year

grazing with sheep helps maintain this habitat.

The sheep flock numbers 2,500 breeding ewes which comprise of 350 purebred Welsh ewes, 650 home bred Welsh half-bred ewes, 650 Lleyn x ewes and surprisingly for what appeared in the last week of March to be a cold farm 1,000 home bred Charollais x ewes!

The farm employs one full time shepherd and uses contractors for shearing and dipping with two veterinary students to assist during lambing.

The aim is to operate as a closed flock with only pure Welsh ewes privately purchased from farms in North Wales. "As this is a unique setting the ewes need to navigate themselves to the best grazing and safety for themselves and their lambs on the Marsh, bought in ewes take some time to do this" states Alex. "Sheep can cause you enough problems but its one less if you don't buy in disease and other peoples issues"

The perception of Charollais X ewe is that they might not

be robust as other terminal sire females and need special attention is dispelled by Alex, "they are very tight skinned and have good mothering ability and milk. With our easy-care system, they are not seen daily when on the Marsh, so we need a ewe who doesn't get rigged on her back, is not susceptible to mastitis but most of all she needs to have the mobility to cover the ground throughout the summer, it takes two days to gather the Marsh and we can walk 26 miles to do it."

The ewe flock lamb indoors in batches of 600 from January to April and turned out depending on the weather. "The Charollais cross lambs sometimes don't look the prettiest but they are easy lambed and quickly up and sucking" they are grazed on the permanent pasture surrounding the farmstead and fed homegrown barley and fodder beet before being turned out onto the Marsh after the last high



spring tide. "My dairy farming colleagues use plate meters but the tide table is my most important grazing tool" Alex quips.

When the tenancy was taken over from the previous retiring tenant in 2007 there were a few Charollais rams that came with the ewe flock but it was a chance meeting with Jan Walton from the Rainbow flock whilst they were both acting as farmer examiners for the University of Liverpool Vet school, that led to Alex, a former pedigree Suffolk breeder, sourcing high muscle EBV rams from the Rainbow Flock

Initially he sought good value in high health status stock tups that were surplus to requirements at Church Farm with rams such as Gawsworth Just Right, Eyelid Jackpot and Rainbow Kasabian, Rainbow Linkin Park making the twelve mile journey to Neston. Now Alex has a standing order for 8 rams every 2 years from the Rainbow flock which must be in the top 10% for muscle and in the top 5% for gigot muscularity.

"As the female line was important to me I have worked with Andrew and Jan over the last 10 years to

keep my bloodlines diverse so we can maximise the potential on our low-cost system but with improved carcase quality, we want tups that are fit for purpose and whilst we were expanding the female lines, Andrew has sourced some rams from the Lowerye flock which performed well also."

Selling lambs throughout the year to maintain cashflow and with a keen eye on costs and workload, everything has to have a purpose within the business and a plan to achieve it.

"We sell the majority of our lambs live-weight through Ruthin Auction Mart, we aim to sell at between 40-44Kg live weight — we are competing with Texels and Beltex cross lambs there and whilst the Charollais cross lambs do not make the top prices, (but I don't pay big luck money!) they certainly make very good prices which brings a good return on our investment".

As well as selling live weight, in August 2016 Alex took advantage of Waitrose becoming the first major supermarket to sell Salt Marsh Lamb where they marketed it as a seasonal delicacy from August to December and was procured from lambs that graze on salt marsh pasture near coastal grassland. This is where the high muscle EBV have really helped with 85% of the Charollais x lambs achieving premiums for hitting the target specification of 18-21Kg carcase weight, with a conformation of Us and Rs but with a very tight specification of fat 2 -3L.

"The Welsh Half-bred ewes lack conformation so I like to choose Charollais rams who are in the top 10% for muscle depth, I am not overly worried about growth



rate as we don't gather the Marsh every week and our 3/4 bred Charollais lambs fit this specification easily. The Texel would also hit the specification but with so few performance recorded Texels within the area L may only be getting an over fed ram that comes with other issues that make it unsuitable for our system. The Lleyn x onto the 3/4 Charollais ewes makes best use of the Charollais conformation from the dam size also. Our killing out % last year was between 48% and 49%.

As Charollais rams with high muscle depth and gigot muscularity are having a positive impact on your system, how do you see the future for the breed as a whole?

"I see no reason that performance recorded Charollais won't maintain its standing in a post Brexit sheep world wherever that leads us, it maybe more challenging than we think currently to make a profit. Look to New Zealand and their farmer groups that have big numbers in their performance recording and breed improvement programmes and encourage that so you can gain genetic progress quicker.

Don't grow wool or rely on feed to tell you what the best animals are. Sell EBVs harder and have confidence that what you produce is what works for the commercial man"


Charollais show superiority in carcase traits

The graphs below show the proportion of each breed in the top 25 of all the rams.
Charollais are marked in blue.
For the two growth traits; 8
Week Weight and Scan weight
Charollais had a good number of rams in that top band. Not as fast for growth as the Suffolk (who had very high index rams on trial) but better than Texel for Scan Weight.

For muscle depth EBV we did not feature so well, but when we move onto carcase traits
Charollais leap forward with a high number of rams in that top slot. For carcase weight we had the most rams indicating a very good killing out percentage and little wastage. For carcase conformation we also scored highly. It is interesting to note that although the Suffolk sired lambs may have grown

RamCompare is the national progeny test for terminal sires. Over two years, 70 rams have produced nearly 8,000 lambs across six commercial farms. Data from these lambs has been analysed to assess the genetic merit of these rams for traits of economic importance. So how has Charollais faired?

It is important to note that the Charollais rams used in the project were not the highest performance ranked within our population. But even though that was the case, the breed has come out extremely well.

Foulrice Salvatore – 17DG07394. Purchased at the 2017 Premier Sale, he is another outcross to anything in our flock and oozes style. He was the top index lamb at Foulrice last year with great loin muscling. BI:420.

Lowerye Ronnie – **16ZVY02674.** A son of Powerhouse and the highest gigot muscularity stock sire in the breed. One of his March born ET sons has raised the bar on gigot muscularity again, with an ebv of +10.25 after CT scanning. MyoMAX Gold and BI:462. Two ET sons of Ronnie have been used in the March lambing flock, and one has had semen used in the RamCompare project.

Lowerye Rioja – 16ZVY02621. Son of Peleus out of a proven Brettles Jet Set daughter. Reared as a twin at grass, he was the heaviest lamb at 8 wks in our March flock in 2016. A good bodied ram with great growth and a white head. BI:398.

We concentrate on high muscle depths and gigot muscularity, and providing high index forage fed shearling rams that will cover more ewes without melting. As with our commercial flock, rams are outwintered on roots and receive no concentrates at all. Management is strictly commercial, with routine foot trimming stopped well over a decade ago. Rams are predominantly sold on farm, in their working clothes.

Genetics have been exported to Norway, Eire, Canada and New Zealand in 2016/7.


Interestingly we have rams that produce leaner carcases and also those that tend to be fatter. At this point the Suffolk and Hampshire Down rams are consistently fatter and the Texel more on the lean side.

The project has then combined all the significant traits into a Carcase Merit Index and you will see that Charollais have the 2nd most rams in this listing just behind the Texel breed, but way ahead of Suffolk, Hampshire Down and Meatling.

The highest ranked Charollais ram within the project was Wedderburn Peleus, who was used on 2 farms through Al. He was 4th highest ranked ram overall.

In the top 11 there were 4 Charollais; Peleus followed by Foulrice On RamCompare, Dalby Malachite and Cannarhars Panache.


Combined breed analysis results 2016/17



These are interim results and an update will be published in May. Also work is being undertaken on days to slaughter, which should be of interest to Charollais.

The trial will now be proceeding to Stage 2 with two additional new farms and further rams.

Charollais have nominated a new team of rams, which should continue to prove our superior traits for prime lamb producers.

A huge buzz of excitement ran through the entire Charollais Sale held at Worcester Market and was topped when the show champion, Abbie Moseley's ram lamb Knockin Shockin smashed the breed record when it sold for 25,000 gns. Putting in the final bid, on his own was Shropshire breeder, Robert Gregory.

"I have followed the progress of this lamb for a long time and always felt he was something really special. He has outstanding Charollais qualities of length, width and a serious backend and to boot is in the top 5% of the breed on performance."

Robert was determined to secure this ram for himself and had to beat off bids from all over the UK and Ireland. The sire Oakchurch Ruben was purchased at the 2016 Premier Sale for 3,200 gns and is out of a home-bred yearling ewe at Abbie's farm at Knockin, near Oswestry.

This price broke the previous ram lamb record of 10,500 gns for Banwy Immense set in 2008.

Other ram lambs in the Knockin pen were amongst the high-priced animals; at 6,000 gns was Knockin Shop which sold to two Northern Ireland breeders, William McAllister and Ian Craig. This was another Oakchurch Ruben son out of Dalby Malachite ewe and Arjane Jumanji grand dam. Just below this at 5,800 gns was

Charollais a Favourite to Maximise Profits

The sheep industry in Northern Ireland is made up of a high percentage of part time farmers, these farmers play a crucial role in the infrastructure of our industry.

David Cromie is one such farmer, a guy with many talents, one wonders how he gets everything fitted in, a keen footballer David plays for his local club and is well known for his speed and skill on the pitch. A joiner by trade David is kept busy with his day job, there is also big demand for his custom made sheep feeders which are very popular. Not content to rest on his laurels David keeps 140 Suffolk Cheviot ewes and 27 pure bred Charollais ewes.

David farms, along with his father Alan, on their family farm at Millhaven, Rathfriland, County Down. The farm was originally a Flax Mill generating work for many people in the area, today David and his dad who both have full time jobs run around 140 Suffolk Cheviot ewes and 90 beef heifers which they buy in to finish.

Sheep have always featured on the farm with David's



Grandfather Willie a keen shepherd and willing to try new ideas purchasing a Charollais ram way back in the early days.
Shortly after a few pure bred Charollais ewes were bought and the XEF prefix was formed. Only a child at this stage David has always had a keen interest in the sheep and as he grew up and took on more work on the farm he built up the sheep numbers with Charollais always a firm favourite.

Sheep are lambed in February and housed two weeks before lambing. Ewes and lambs usually turned out within 2 -3 days of lambing, even this year with the wet weather he was able to get them out. He is lucky that his ground is dry and with plenty of shelter. Lambs are mainly grass fed with some creep introduced

at around six weeks. He starts weighing them from 11/12 weeks and most are ready around this time unless they have had a set back. Lambs are sold direct to ABP where they killout Es and Us so he gets a bonus.

Four years ago David decided to purchase a few Charollais Pure bred ewes re-establishing their Charollais Flock. In 2017 he ventured across to Worcester Premier to purchase a Charollais Ram.

Involved with the Daera Sheep Business Group David is keen to improve his Flock and get the best returns. Benchmarking within the group gives an indicator of how you are performing





Quality Breeding puts Arbryn Flock in the Top League

Arwyn and Jane Thomas originally started breeding Charollais in 1990, at their farm near Whitland, Carmarthenshire, with foundation ewes bought in from Cecil Thomas, Wolston Flock and Emrys Bowen, of the Cennen flock. Whilst Arwyn worked away from home frequently, he was attracted to the breed primarily due to the easy lambing.

"I received great advice and inspiration from two people in the breed when we started off; Professor David Morris of the Penywern flock and Dilwyn Davies of the Highway flock. They both guided me in the right direction."

When asked if he had a favourite, or most iconic sheep from his flock, he explained he found it hard to identify just one. It's clear Arwyn has revered many of his sheep over the years; but one ewe in the Arjane flock was a firm favourite, ZNP 2004, bought from David Morris

At the dispersal sale of the original Arjane Flock in 2010, she was lot 1, selling as a 9 year old for 3,200gns. At the same sale two of her ewe lambs sold for 6,000gns and 5,500gns. Her progeny lives on in flocks around the country; her bloodline can be found in her grandson, Sant Andras Sergeant Major, who sold for 9,000gns at Worcester Premier sale 2017. "It is so pleasing to see these good genetics come through for a variety of flocks."

On the ram side certainly two of the most influential sires within the flock were Galtres Dominator and Penrhos Ibanez and on the selling side Arwyn thought Arjane Klansman was one of his best.

Change of Direction

When reaching his fiftieth birthday, Arwyn took a break from breeding, with the intention of travelling to New Zealand and planned to return to the breed in 2012. The Arbryn flock was created, forming a new flock based on flock genetics from the Arjane families, utilising frozen embryos and four selected ewes, including Elmwick KitKat, one of Arwyn's favourite ewes.

"The main struggle when starting with the new flock was to find the right ram. I knew what I wanted but finding it was not so easy." In the end his new



stock tup turned up in an unexpected place. Arwyn was judging the Charollais classes at the Great Yorkshire Show in 2013, when a ram lamb entered the ring that caught his attention immediately: Shamrock Northern Star bred by Cyril Dougherty in Yorkshire.

While negotiations of a sale took a while, the sale was agreed two days prior to Al commencing for Arwyn back in Wales. Interestingly the tup's sire was Crogham Java, whose dam went back to a Penywern bred ewe.

Shamrock Northern Star became an invaluable asset to the Arbryn flock for the next four years, producing incredibly successful progeny. Sadly, he passed away in 2017, with Arwyn describing him as the "biggest bit of luck I've ever bought".

AI & Embryo Transfer

Arwyn highly recommends implementing Al within pedigree breeding. "I have used Al since forming the Arjane flock. One great advantage is the concise lambing period, so I can arrange time off from my full-time job to dedicate my attention to lambing duties"

His advice to anyone considering AI for the first time would be to speak to an established breeder who has been using it for a while and attend an AI day, as it requires a lot of attention to detail, deadlines and dates are important, as they impact the quality and response you get.

With a background in showing dairy cattle, Arwyn has always enjoyed showing; he plans to compete

This policy has however led to many successes in the showring, with highlights including twice champion at Worcester Premier sale and six times champion at the Builth sale.

While he has bred a Royal Welsh champion, owned by Adrian Davies, Arwyn has not yet won the championship at the Royal Welsh Show; this is his remaining show objective.

There is only one year that Arwyn has not competed at the Royal Welsh show since he was 15 years old and that was in 2011 when he had the honour to judge the Charollais classes.

Quality Always Sells

With Brexit impending, Arwyn emphasises that top quality product will always sell, therefore the focus should be on quality breeding and conformation.

"I feel that a good eye combined with both performance recording and particularly CT scanning help identify those animals which are superior in fleshing and conformation, which are traits essential for the breed's progress. My aim with the Arbryn Flock is to remain with the same number of breeding ewes and retain quality, which hopefully will appeal to my customers."



A family farm in Somerset is adamant that Charollais tups are the best solution as a terminal sire for their commercial flock.

Keith Barrow together with his wife Jackie and their two sons, James and George farm at Halsey Cross Farm (trading as R & F Barrow & Son) 230 metres above sea level in the village of Over Stowey on the edge of the Quantock Hills. "We are the third generation of our family to farm here and have certainly seen some changes over that time." The farm is now a mixed unit with calves bought and reared to finish beef together with a suckler herd.

"When my eldest son came back to the farm when finishing school

we took the decision to go back into a commercial ewe flock." The farm used to run Suffolk and Scotch Half-breds which were tupped with a Suffolk ram, but since getting back into breeding sheep in 2011 they opted for Suffolk x Mule ewes all tupped with Charollais rams.

The farm tupped 530 ewes this year and generally runs around 500 – 600. "We buy our ewes from Sedgemoor market in July as yearlings. We don't go for the top drawer animals as we have plenty of good grazing, which ensures the ewes go on and improve once they get to us."

The farm works closely with a neighbouring unit which runs a digester unit. Linking up with them has given them access to additional land for a period prior to it being sown for crops for the digester. They also carry out all the contract work on the unit, spreading the cost of larger scale equipment over a greater acreage.

The ewes are run on a high level of management and as soon as they arrive are vaccinated against toxoplasmosis and enzootic abortion and then

put onto the Heptavac P system. A similar level of attention to detail is given to the selection of the Charollais tups.

BUYING RAMS

All the rams are purchased from another neighbour, Patrick Tully of the Bincombe Flock. "We like to see how our rams have been reared and you can't get any better than keeping an eye on them over the hedge during the winter." Patrick rears his tups on roots right the way through the autumn and winter without the necessity to feed any additional concentrate. In July the family go through the tups and cull out anything that is getting a bit old. "It is better to get a good price for a decent cull than run them on too long, suffer reduced service power and then up with a disposal bill!" They then visit the Bincombe Flock to pick out their new rams.

RAM INSPECTION

To make sure that the rams are working to capacity they bring along two veterinary surgeons to the farm who measure testicle circumference and sample semen from our rams. "This way we know from the information and advice from the vets which rams are

100% fertile on that day and who should perform best at tupping time."

The vendor, Patrick is quite happy with this procedure "it makes for an interesting time; very few rams over the years 'fail' their test and I know what leaves the farm is functioning and there can be no come back."

Keith is full of praise for the tups they purchase "the Charollais breed has length, good tight skins and they are fit for the job. You could say that a bit more wool cover might help but I would not use a crossbred ram to compensate for this. Anything with a heavy shoulder will give me lambing problems and I know that an easy birth is critical to lamb survival and rearing rates."

Teaser rams are introduced (they use Scotch Black faced rams) prior to the rams going in with groups of about 90 ewes, 2 rams in each group. Both rams are moved to another group every 19 days.

"We find the Charollais are very keen to work; I like to see a ram run up the hill serve a ewe and then look for another one and not lie down! Ewes are run on the best grass either our own or rented in land at tupping time."

The flock is scanned in mid November and any empty ewes are culled at that point. This is usually around 7% to 8%. Dependant on the weather ewes are housed 2 – 3 weeks prior to lambing which starts on the 14th January. This year we put up a new shed which is big enough for all the sheep and lambing pens under one roof, which has been a great benefit. Ewes are fed a T.M.R mix utilising cereals grown on the farm.

At lambing time it is all hands on deck with all the family on duty including Keith's father Ray. This ensures that there is someone in the shed 24/7 to minimise losses. Every ewe is penned up for 24 hours and then housed loose for a further 2 days before being turned out.

"We will put a mac on all lambs, which I think is just for peace of mind. The weather can, as we know from this year turn very quickly and why take a risk for the small cost and effort of using this extra protection. We cannot praise enough, the vigour and lambing ease we get with the Charollais cross lambs. This saves time and effort at lambing time and means we end up with a good % of lambs reared." At

lambing time any ewe that has problems or is not feeding her lambs well enough gets a big red spray on the head and will be culled after her lambs have gone, this is about 8% giving a total cull of the flock year for the year of 15%.

After being at grass with access to creep feed from about 2 weeks of age, the Charollais cross lambs are ready to go from 10 weeks of age. "There would be some up to weight earlier than this but we like to make up a lorry load to take to ABP Yetminster. We pick lambs at 39 kgs and above; the Charollais are very flexible, they can be killed at a wide weight range without

running to fat." Data back from the kill sheets proves the Charollais worth with constant U and E grades and the majority being U3L.

So what for the future at Halsey Cross?

"I see our ewe numbers increasing and we will certainly keep using good Charollais tups; they have worked well for us on our system for the past 7 years and I see nothing than can better what they achieve for the flock in terms of performance, quality and profitability."

The Foulrice flock, owned by C W Marwood & Son from Whenby, North Yorkshire, has been recognised by AHDB Beef & Lamb as the most progressive flock of Charollais sheep based on the flock's genetic merit & improvement over the past 10 years.

500 Pedigree Ewes

The Foulrice flock, set up in 1982, now has some 500 pedigree ewes and shearlings. Charles says: "We chose the Charollais breed because we wanted something suitable for both the early and later lamb market with fast growth and a quality carcase. We started the flock with two shearling ewes, three ewe lambs and a ram from John Barber of Wymondham, Norfolk.

In 1986 we visited France, purchasing a dozen ewe lambs and we also added a small number of females from flock dispersals. Since this time we have maintained a closed flock, only buying in some of our stock rams."

Charles sells pedigree stock both through markets and off farm, regularly taking consignments to the premier sale in Worcester, both NSA sales at Builth



Wells, Kelso and smaller sales throughout the north of England. "We do have customers who like to see rams in their home environment and so prefer to purchase rams off farm untrimmed," explains Charles.

Recording Starts

"We started recording in about 1984 as we could see the value in keeping records to help improve performance of the flock. In the early days it was only weight and growth rates that were recorded," explains Charles.

"We now benefit from the use of ultrasound and computed tomography (CT) scanning which is a good management aid, helping us to produce animals with good figures, which are pleasing to the eye, with all the right physical attributes. The benefits of this are seen at sales where rams with tight skin and good conformation attract the best prices.

At the end of the day, we are primarily producing rams for the commercial farmer and this information means they can make more informed decisions

on their purchases with the use of both indexes and estimated breeding values (EBVs) for different traits."

Having a large flock with a spread of genetics allows Charles and son Stephen to not only use purchased rams, but also to use some of the best homebred rams as well.

"This allows us to maintain the consistency of type within our flock as well as driving our performance forward," says Charles. "Skeletal correctness coupled with a tight skin and carcase quality is of paramount importance for any commercial farmer selling butchers lambs. Couple this with EBVs which identify fast growth, good muscle and positive fat cover and this will give our customers rams that produce lambs that can grow quickly, finish well off grass, producing carcases that meet market specification.

Influential Sires

"Six years ago we bought Dalby Mount Aloe for 2,000 gns along with Lowerye Neils Favourite, both have been influential in the flock, producing the type of rams we wanted, particularly Foulrice Osprey giving excellent conformation.

Last year we purchased Dalby Sherman at Worcester who had the physical attributes we desired and was the second-highest rated ram of the year, with an index of 483. Dalby Sherman also has the best muscle EBV for the breed (which was backed up by good muscle depth at ultrasound scanning) and his growth at both eight weeks and scanning was exceptional."





The Ingram family nearly completed a clean sweep in the


Charollais classes under the judgement of Northern Ireland breeder, Mr David Mawhinney.






