## *Top performing commercial flock values Charollais*

### **Dan Phipps tells us about the sheep flock at Godolphin**

The new National Sheep Association Chairman, Dan Phipps heads up one of the top performing commercial flocks in the UK. The flock of just under 2,000 ewes, a mixture of home-bred Suffolk and Texel cross Mules and bought-in North Country Mules share their home at the world renowned Godolphin Stud, just outside the Suffolk town of Newmarket. The global horse breeding and racing operation, owned by HH Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, is set in 2,547 acres which is divided into 440 grass paddocks. A further 4,000 arable acres of Dalham Hall Estate and a further

1,200 acres at Moulton Paddocks completes the setup.

Dan has been head of the sheep enterprise for the past 15 years, when the decision was taken at Godolphin to own their own flock, rather than relying on flying flocks to manage the grassland. “The sheep flock will always run second to the horses and for this reason it is not always possible to take decisions you consider best for the flock; but the positive aspects of being on the stud soon put these small issues into perspective.”

The flock lambs in two groups; the first lambs come in mid January and run through until the end of February. A second smaller group is lambed in May. Any empty ewes from the first batch are moved to the May group.

## **CHAROLLAIS FIRST AWAY**

Dan runs a mixture of ram breeds; Charollais, Texel, Suffolk and Charollais Beltex. Each have their part to play in the system. The Charollais rams go to the home-bred cross bred ewes, Suffolk and Texel. “These are always the first to be tupped, so the fast growth rate of the Charollais ensures these lambs are also first away to market.” The mules go to the Texel and Suffolk, in part to provide the replacement ewes for the flock. “We do have more problems with mastitis in the Texel cross ewes, so are trying to keep more Suffolk cross ewes back and also a few Charollais cross.” The stud has sufficient shed space for lambing, so everything is lambed indoors and turned out after 48 hours. Ewes are fed fodder beet to supplement the feed value of grass and lambs have free access to creep pellets.

## **NO HARDINESS ISSUES**

Dan has no problems whatsoever with the hardiness of the Charollais cross lambs “we see absolutely no difference between the different breeds and all cope with any harsh weather. We select paddocks with good shelter at turn out.”

## **FLOCK MANAGEMENT**

Flock management is spot on, with a well-planned timetable of treatments etc. “At five weeks of age

all lambs are dosed to prevent coccidiosis, given a wormer, a vaccine for pasteurella and clostridial diseases and a blowfly treatment. We know this is unusual, but it’s a very small dose for the size of the lamb causing them no issues and providing fly cover for 21 weeks. This means we can be assured of no fly issues when drawing finished lambs.”


Dan explains that the stud hosts many high profile visitors and it is essential that all the stock look healthy, happy and well-cared for at all times. “We follow a regime of footrot vaccine; 2 doses for ewe lambs and then an annual booster thereafter. All ewe lambs also have a vaccination to protect them from enzootic and toxoplasmosis abortion.”

## **RAM BUYING**

Dan’s annual trip to the Kelso Ram Sale was cut short in 2020. In past years he has purchased tups at the sale from the Artnagullion, Hekra and Hundalee flocks. In 2020 purchases were off farm from local flocks; Crogham and Fordham, including some very high index tups.

All rams are fertility tested upon arrival on farm. “I was very pleased with the new group of tups, all were fertile. We ran 3 tups with one group of 240 ewes and all bar a handful were in-lamb early and scanned at 192%, the highest figure achieved this season.”

The Charollais tups will certainly continue to be a part of this fascinating sheep enterprise and maybe Dan will be convinced to keep back a few more Charollais cross ewes in the future.

Our family journey with Charollais started nearly 40 years ago, in 1981, with Dad aged 19, spotting a newspaper article featuring the Barber family and the first Charollais they brought over to the country. William, who at the time was shepherding, saw the opportunity to start his own flock of sheep and be an early adopter of this new breed in this country. He imported some ewe lambs and a ram lamb direct from France, having never seen the breed in the flesh at that point.

Over the 40 years since, Dad has climbed the journey from at the beginning, being placed bottom of the line up in the show ring, to focusing on getting up the ladder, to focus on breeding the best genetics to offer for sale. Our current flock ethos focuses on Charollais being sustainable and

profitable within our wider sheep business, whilst offering the most current and top genetics, for both pedigree and commercial buyers. We sell both Charollais rams and females, with focus on correct good body and style.

COVID-19 didn't affect our sales in 2020, despite Builth and Kelso being cancelled. It has been the best sales year for us privately across the business and all breeds, with buyers sourcing rams early. Charollais go well with any white-faced breeds, from Cheviot to Welsh types and Scotch Blackface: basically, using Charollais on any shorter bodied ewe breed to add length and size to lambs carcasse.

We are positive about the future of the breed, the type of Charollais that succeed are those with long carcasse and muscle in the right places, which will always satisfy prime lamb breeders. We'd say the biggest threat to the breed are internal factors, not threat from other breeds: breeders should focus on culling hard and having a positive competitive spirit which increases buyer demand and therefore less tup sharing.

Our advice to newcomers to the breed is to keep the number of females low and quality high; aim for good quality always, look for consistency in female breeding lines, who is breeding the best sheep year on year and retain replacements based on it.

We founded Gwyndy Charollais in 2003; at the time we were running a large commercial flock of sheep and had been using Charollais rams for quite a while. Part of the decision to start our own flock was to breed our own rams.

We began selling rams commercially from 2005, selling yearlings at Builth (back then it was in the tents) and we have sold at both Builth 1 & 2 most years since. Over recent years we have sold the majority of rams from home.

To sell at Builth is one of the highlights of the calendar year, to see customers coming back year on year, the atmosphere and to socialise – farming can be a bit isolating so this event is a great occasion for both mindset and business. I look

forward to selling there again in the future.

We bought two stock rams in 2020, purchasing Boyo Vancouver privately from David Roberts, who I think is going to be a tremendous ram and Wernfawr Vinnie from David and Paul Curran at Worcester Premier Sale for 3,200gns, bought for his style and power with great conformation.

My favourite breed to run with Charollais commercially have to be Texel X ewes, specifically Texel X mules – the lambs grow fast and hit the grades. Remember the ram makes a hell of a difference – make sure you buy a good ram. When we farmed commercially, we used to sell both live and dead – mostly deadweight.

Charollais sired lambs are very consistent in how they kill out – at least two thirds of them with E and U grades off grass. Charollais are still probably the best crossing breed in the country, for easy lambing and fast growth, to get lambs away and get them in market while the highest prices are there.

Advice for those to start a flock or newcomers – “look for good conformation in what you buy and what you retain, especially in your ewes. Since we started the breed has got bigger – but remember bigger isn’t always better.”

Our flock ethos at the beginning was to produce good quality rams aimed at the commercial market and also top grade prime lambs. In more recent years, our focus has shifted towards producing rams (& females) for the pedigree breeder. However, that commercial focus has never faltered.

We have a strict culling policy on tup lambs as we have a saying “if we wouldn’t like to breed from them, we don’t want anyone to breed from them”. The bonus of Charollais is that any lambs that don’t meet the ‘pedigree grade’ still achieve top prices as killing out %s and grades. The cull ewes also sell for a premium (this year our top was £186)!

Our aim for next year with the breed is to keep producing rams that stand out at Worcester Premier

Sale. Moving forward we would also like to attend some of the larger county shows throughout the UK, to compete against the best flocks the country has to offer!

Both of us work off farm, so we find Charollais are a low maintenance, easy keep sheep. To anyone starting out, our advice would be to purchase ewes from just one breeder and build your flock from there.

all been a great help and offered advice when sought.

I breed Charollais purely for a commercial basis. Breeding traits with the commercial farmer in mind and ensuring all my stock is bred and produced fit for purpose and performance, ready to work. What the commercial farmer wants is always something I consider when buying new stock rams, I always look for gigot. My current stock ram is Edstaston U R The Man, bought for his power, depth of gigot and overall style and commercial attributes.

90% of our ewes are homebred; when selecting ewe lambs to retain, I look for size and style, good skin, legs and depth of gigot: all commercial traits. We cull hard and sell all lambs deadweight to Woodheads (Morrisons Supermarket Abattoir), we aim to sell between 40 and 45kg; the beauty with Charollais is they kill out at any weight, you don't need to get them fat for them to kill out well, they are always E & U's.

Coronavirus impacted on our sales in 2020, with both Builth and Kelso cancelled, but despite this our average prices were great and our sales have been phenomenal. We have noticed that buyer confidence and trust has played a key role in private sales this year, with our return customers who buy off us every year buying stock unseen as they trust in our stock. The farmers who buy our Charollais run them with a real mixture of ewe breeds; mostly mules of some description but commonly they are mostly all lowland sheep breeds or lowland crosses we sell into. I was always sceptical of Signet, but this year selling stock privately there has been a premium for high index animals, so Signet has certainly paid for itself this

year in regards to selling high index tup; commercial farmers are paying notice to it.

My favourite memory with the breed has probably been the success at Builth Wells 2 the last couple of years, it gives us pride in what we've achieved. We have won small pens class, first prize shearling etc, in an environment competing against so many people with fellow quality commercial flocks, that gives a sense of pride.

My advice to newcomers to the breed is always buy quality over quantity, never be scared to ask a question no matter how silly you may think it is.

I have always admired the stock produced by Myfyr Evans, and have used Rhaedr rams previously, so could not let the opportunity to purchase such a quality flock go by.

It includes many families, going back to the likes of **ONE7275** (sold 2,250gns – Southam production sale 2008), and **OYLK7067** (top price gimmer 3,000gns Penrhos dispersal sale).

Sires such as **Hurricane**, **Klassact**, **Neo** and more recently **Puckerup** (whose daughters are outstanding), are in the backbreeding of the ewes.

I know these top genetics will be an excellent addition to the Lower Denby flock.

loin and have exceptional gigots. Being in the North of England, they need to be hardy, but still retain Charollais characteristics. Most of our rams go commercially.

Our rams are used on a variety of commercial ewes from Mules and Mashams to Lleyns and Texel crosses. We sell at Worcester Premier most years. I strongly believe that the very best commercial rams should equate to the very best pedigree rams. We lamb around 150 charollais ewes pure and 40 – 50 hoggs/year. One of the attributes of Charollais is their ease of lambing. Our lambing sheds are two miles away from where we live, so it's not always feasible to be there when every sheep lambs.

By putting Charollais rams on pure Suffolk ewes we get spring lambs that finish within nine weeks; it is a great cross that fits in well with our system. New breeders entering the breed need a good grounding in what the commercial man wants. There is a lot of satisfaction in winning shows, but for us it is as important to hear from commercial farmers that they are pleased with their rams longevity and ability to work well, that their Charollais sired lambs are selling well at the right weights, within the right specifications and usually sooner than their lambs sired by Texels.

Regular weights were collected on all farms so all rams will get a fair trial.

**What does RamCompare mean for Charollais?**

In the 2020 results, we showed that there is a consistent £4 per lamb difference in progeny value between rams. We have seen that rams who excel in their Carcase Value traits have rated highly with their Muscle Depth Estimated Breeding Value (EBV), CT lean Weight EBV and CT muscularity, suggesting strong links between these traits. The Fat Depth EBV and CT Fat Weight EBV are also good predictors of fat class. The Scan Weight EBV is a strong indicator of on-farm growth and days to slaughter (where up to a 14 day difference was seen across all farms in terms of average progeny finishing time). The Scan Weight EBV also links to the carcase weight of lambs, which helps to improve carcase value.

One key finding is that the best rams from all breeds are comparable, using EBVs to select superior genetics is more important than switching between breeds.

Individual rams excelled with the 2019 lamb crop and case studies were written to coincide with the 2020 results being published. The results drew attention to the success of Charollais sires who ranked highly for particular traits:

## RamCompare Update

RamCompare is just completing its fifth year and has been extremely successful having collected data from a total of 283 pedigree terminal sire rams. Included in this vast dataset of over 26,000 commercially reared lambs are 5,601 progeny from 58 Charollais sires.

Eleven new Charollais rams were used in 2019 alongside linkage ram; Dalby Ranieri 16PE04907, provided by Charles Sercombe, who was used across all commercial farms in 2019 mating plans. ChazCompare collected data for their second year, testing Dalby Ranieri against seven other Charollais stock rams available through the Redhill and Rainbow flocks.

Progeny growth is monitored from birth, with all abattoir kill data collected as standard. However due to COVID-19 restrictions, we were not able to conduct the ultrasound scanning data on all farms.

project last year, with rams from the Rainbow and Redhill flocks featuring strongly in the lists of top performing breeding lines for carcase weight and conformation, supported by data pulled through from the ChazCompare dataset.

◆ Following on previous success, Dylan Laws provided yet another high performing Charollais for the Days to Slaughter trait, who sat comfortably inside the top 10 rams tested last season and was once again top Charollais for this trait.

RamCompare has shown the commercial worth of selecting rams based on using EBVs so ram buyers are becoming more aware and using EBVs to help inform their selection decisions.

## RamCompare Interim Year

While the first phase of the project comes to a close, there is real industry interest in extending this area of work. We expect to see the next phase of these activities established in 2021. ## **Charles Sercombe, new Chairman of the Charollais Society, answers our questions on his Charollais flock and his hopes and ambitions for the Society under his leadership.**

*Charles runs a multi-layer sheep business with his wife Helen, from just outside Melton Mowbray in Leicestershire. At the 150 hectare home farm, Sandlands, he runs nucleus pedigree flocks of Charollais, Lley, Blue Texel and Abermax. They rent a further 200 hectares from a large estate 8 miles away where they lamb 1,600 commercial ewes.*

### **Tell us about your pedigree flock**

I have had a flock of Charollais sheep since 1986, when I started the Dalby Charollais flock with one shearling and 3 ewe lambs and built it up since then. The breed has been ever-present in my farming business. We fell in love with them early on because they do so much that we feel is important for the sheep sector. We have met so many really nice

people and had tremendous fun and enjoyment from our association with Charollais. I certainly can never envisage not having Charollais sheep on the farm.

### **What do you want to achieve for the breed as Chairman?**

I would really like over the next few years to build on the sound foundations that we have as a breed. I am totally convinced that the Charollais breed has a highly important role to play in the UK sheep industry moving forward. I think we have unique qualities as a breed that will be a perfect fit as we move into a

more sustainable, easy care and diverse way of agriculture. The attributes of easy lambing, quick growth and easy fleshing will really come to the fore in the next few years. The breed will nick well with the crosses that will be used; Texel cross, Suffolk cross, as people move away from the stratified system to keeping self-contained flocks. This will open up many opportunities for the Charollais.

### **What areas do you think the breed can improve on?**

I think every breed can improve. The work that has been done over the 44 years that Charollais have been in the UK has been phenomenal. We have changed the breed out of all recognition from the first animals to arrive. But there is still work to do. We have to address the perception of lack of hardiness, we have to make sure that we maintain the quick growth, easy lambing and natural fleshing but put in there a tougher sheep that is more robust that suits a wide variety of systems. We have evidence that this is taking place with the results coming out of the Welsh Hill Ewe Project, proving that Charollais can fit and adapt to



those farming conditions. There are lines and strains within our breed that will enable us to do that. We also need to build on that diverse genetic base that we have and create an industry leading breed.

### **How can we boost the profile of the Charollais breed?**

I think we have a major role in the next 12-18 months to boost the profile of Charollais. If I have a disappointment over the past few years, it is that we have lost ground to our competitors in the way that we have gone about it. Those of us who work with Charollais on a day-to-day basis know the fantastic job they do. There is a large tranche of commercial sheep farmers out there that reap the rewards from using Charollais rams. What we need to do now is to tap into that commercial base and resource; identify role models who can give us statements and articles to persuade other farmers that Charollais really do deliver on the ground. The breed does as we claim.

### **What is it like having your daughter (Victoria) part of the breed?**

Interesting! It causes some very interesting and lively debates and discussions when we talk about sheep. But I wouldn't have it any other way. She enjoys the Society as much as Helen and I do, meeting people and really likes the sheep. She misses working with the sheep on a daily basis due to her other work commitments. ### **What previous roles have you held in the Society and how will this help in the role as Chairman?**

I have held a number of roles within the Society; for the past 6 years I have been Chairman of the Finance and General Purposes Committee. I sit on the Judges Committee and have carried out sale inspection at all the major sales and provided sheep and promoted the breed on exhibition stands. dramatically over the past 12 months and I think it will continue to change over the next few years. As a Society we will have to adapt and adjust to the needs of our members. But I believe with the talented people we have on Council, the fantastic administration and support that we have from the office at Crogham Farm, we will be able to do that. My wish is that we can take all of our members with us on that journey; we can listen to the needs of members and take on board what they are saying and then try and make the best informed decisions to move the breed forward to make it better for everyone.

### **What roles do you currently hold in the farming sector?**

Currently within the wider agricultural industry I have had a number of roles; Chairman of the Sheep Health and Welfare Group, currently I am Chairman of the Sheep Breeders Roundtable which is a fascinating group of people who meet biennially to discuss the genetic trends and the changes in the industry and this helps keep Charollais in the forefront and involved. My most high

profile role at the minute is to be the sheep industry lead on the Defra Animal Health and Welfare Pathway. That has been 2 ½ years so far and looks like we still have a way to go. But their proposals will change completely the way we look after our sheep in the UK. There are some highly innovative and interesting ideas coming out of this group and hopefully, as I mentioned earlier, the Charollais will fit into some of these requirements; easy lambing, easier care do impact on animal welfare. These wider roles give me a really good take and feel for what is around the corner and what the likely trends and developments will hold.

### **What are the benefits of selling tups at sales like Worcester Premier Sale and Builth as opposed to off farm?**

We do both, I would say there are benefits in both systems. If you sell from home you can build up a one-to-one relationship with your customer and get feedback on how your rams have performed. By going into the live auction system, you can raise the price but often you don't have any further contact with the buyers. I am a keen supporter of

the live market system of selling stock; it helps us set the price. As a breeder you can visit sales and see the trends and see what other breeders are producing and get a feel for the direction and standard of other flocks.

### **What do you feel is the importance of performance recording?**

I believe, and for me rightly, that performance recording is an essential part of genetic improvement in any form of livestock. We have used it in our flock for over 30 years and it has helped us with decisions on which lines to continue to develop. "If you don't measure it, you can't manage it" it is a simple saying but it is absolutely true. The future of agriculture will be more about performance recording, benchmarking, comparing yourself to others, trying to run an efficient, effective and sustainable business.

### **What wisdom can you give to new breeders coming into and our younger breeders?**

I don't have any wisdom but I can pass on what I have learnt from mistakes I have made! We

all make mistakes, young or old newcomers to the breed.

I found it pretty daunting as a 21 year old when I bought my first sheep. I was lucky I made some good contacts and friendships. The advice I can give is to get involved within your region, pick the brains of more established breeders, try and watch, look, learn and listen to all the things they are doing with their sheep and try and embed yourself into the breed. Then it's time to ask questions; historically the older generation have been somewhat reticent to pass on those pearls of wisdom to younger breeders.

This is something I really want to change and hopefully we can get our Next Generation Group going and involve more experienced breeders to pass on hints on selection, growing, preparation of stock. The skills are all there, we have a tremendous wealth of knowledge within our ranks; we now need to establish the route by which to pass these onto those who want to learn. But there is no silver bullet, you have to put the effort in yourself and learn from your mistakes.

### RECORD BREAKING YEAR FOR CHAROLLAIS FEMALES

The females of the Charollais breed were truly on fire in 2020; demand at every auction sale and on-farm was at an all-time high. A mixture of well-established flocks looking for that something special, new flocks stocking up and commercial farmers looking to secure Charollais genetics for some crossbreeding, made sure that prices and clearance rates were terrific.

#### TULLYEAR PRODUCTION SALE

Leading the way was the Production Sale of the Tullyear Flock in Northern Ireland; certainly the special sale of the year. Drew Cowan established the flock in 1986 and soon was recognised as a leading force in the breed. Over the years, they have always purchased quality sheep, which are true to Charollais type, often returning to French breeding to inject some variation. The sheep have always had good muscle, long loins, a tight skin and of course a bit of style. The depth of quality within the flock has been acknowledged by many judges

as the flock has been victorious no less than 10 times in the Northern Ireland Flock Competition.

The sale had an entry of 108 in-lamb 2 shear and shearing ewes and broke the auction record for a Charollais female not just once but twice! Leading the way at 7,500 gns was a two-shear ewe with great power and style. After some rapid bidding including many on-line bids, the ewe sired by Tullyear Egbert and out of a Bawnard Keystone daughter was

knocked down to the Ingram Family of the Logie Durno and Loanhead Flocks, Aberdeenshire. The ewe was carrying a single to a ram of their breeding; Logie Durno Van the Man. The previous record for a female Charollais was 7,000 gns set in 2011.

Attracting a lot of attention was the in-lamb shearing, Tullyear Uptown Lady, sired by Loanhead Topgun and out of a home bred Tullyear sired dam. A cracker of an ewe she attracted a flurry of bids before finally being knocked

Her sire was Edstaston Toulouse and out of a Bawnard Keystone Dam; this stunning girl was much sought after with Robert and Jeanette Gregory of the Edstaston Flock, from Shropshire picking up the final bid at 5,500gns.

Two regular in-lamb ewe sales in the calendar are the Saucy Sale at Worcester and the High Flyers event at Hereford. These sales are organised by groups of flocks who pride themselves on presenting top quality animals for their buyers. 2020 was no exception.

### **HIGH FLYERS**

Next best in the prices was from Robert Gregory's Edstaston flock at 2,000 gns, sold to Declan Miley, Co. Roscommon. The ewe lamb, sired by Knockin Shockin was out of the flock's most successful female line and had Performance figures in the top 1%.

### **DUNGANNON EXPORT SALE**

In Northern Ireland the Dungannon Export sale was a stormer of a sale with averages well up and top prices shared amongst a number of flocks. Topping the trade at 2,920 gns was a Knockin Shop sired in-lamb ewe from the Artnagullion pen of William McAllister, out of a Castellau Figurehead sired homebred ewe., purchased by Richard Powell, Iskeymeadow Flock. He also purchased another Knockin Shop daughter for 1,850gns.

Knockin Shockin sired lamb and 1,050gns for the other. The Devenney flock also went to 1,300gns for a Logie Durno daughter sired by Hollylodge Supreme.

The Berry Brothers, Banville Pen sold their top at 1,550gns to M. Brolly, Co. Donegal. A great muscled ewe sired by Super Mario from the H13 French flock. Another from the same pen selling to E. Shanahan, Co. Cork The top from the Rockvillia Flock of David and Liz Mawhinney went to Co. Cork. An Artnagullion Trojan daughter selling to E. Shanahan for 1,650gns.

Ewe lambs were also making the money with Graham Foster's Springhill pen topping at 1,450gns out of a Rhaeadr dam and sired by Logie Durno Untouchable, 2019 Worcester Champion, this lot sold to Harry Stevenson, Portadown. Co. Carlow breeder, Sinead Brophy purchased two at 1,400gns and 1,250gns, sired by Rhaeadr Undercover and a Logie Durno Untouchable sired lamb.

### **TREBARN DISPERSAL SALE**

The dispersal sale of John Osborne's Trebarn flock was held in Exeter Market as part of the annual female sale. As well as local support, buyers came from as far afield as Aberdeenshire

and Yorkshire. Topping the day's trading was a shearling ewe by an Artnagullion sire out of an Arbryn Nugget ewe. She was knocked down at 2,000 gns to Patrick Tully for his Bincombe flock. The ewe was in lamb to the 2,400 gns Bronwydd Undeniable.

### **SKIPTON SALE**

In the North of England the annual sale at Skipton Market enjoyed good clearance rates and strong averages up on the previous year. Leading and long-standing pedigree breeders, the Marwood family from near York achieved the top price for the second year running with a bid of 1,000gns.

Their 2020 price leader was by the Dalby Mount Aloe's son, Foulrice Osprey, out of a Wernfawr Jim sired ewe and carrying twins to Galtres Upper Class. This shearling was bought by Ben Radley, Loaningfoot flock who had travelled down purposely for the first time after seeing the ewe on social media and seeking to add different bloodlines to the flock.

### **AVERAGES**

The total number of females sold through Society Sales in 2020 was over 400 and they averaged a massive £810.18 with a clearance rate of 92.5%



## The Charollais Genomic Archive

### Data from the past may hold the key to the future

The Charollais breed was one of the first in the UK to establish a Sire Reference Scheme (SRS) in 1990. The SRS supported the progeny testing of young rams and created the genetic linkage between flocks on which modern evaluations have been founded. It also brought breeders together and greatly helped in establishing the foundation from which the breed's success has grown.

It was an exciting time for the breed, as we learnt about the

genetic merit of different breeding lines and some real stars were discovered that went on to change the breed. In no breed, did the creation of a Sire Reference Scheme have such a lasting impact.

The rams from which semen was taken and stored were some of the best known, measured and evaluated Charollais sheep in the country, so when the opportunity recently arose to genotype these animals from semen held by

Charollais Sires, I wanted to grab the opportunity to create a permanent legacy to capture and record the genetic architecture of the breed's founders.

### Support from Neogen for the Charollais Genomic Archive

In collaboration with Charollais Sires, AHDB approached Neogen for assistance – as Neogen have been providing RamCompare with a range of genotyping services over the last four years.

animals. Using their world class laboratory, Neogen offer a range of different testing options for sheep, which include.

- DNA screening for parentage
- Genotyping to determine genetic merit & genomic breeding values
- Commercial traits, genetic recessives and causative mutations – such as Myostatin, Scrapie, Fertility and Microphthalmia markers.

### **What have we sampled in this project?**

Charollais Sires made semen available from 79 Charollais rams that have been used within the former Sire Reference Scheme. These rams have produced over 13,700 Signet recorded progeny, showing the massive impact they have had on the breed – not to mention the generations of lambs that followed them.

Rams included in this new genomic hall of fame include those with lots of progeny (progeny number in brackets), such as Crogham Centurion (1056), Rutland Ensign (653), Inglis

Lloyd (577), Arjane Master Mac (573), Crogham Commissioner (532) and Logie Durno Earl of Dunbar (462) and some of the older rams that are found in many a back pedigree; including Netherallan Majestic King, Scratchmere Benneton and Haultwick Harrier.

A significant investment was required to genotype these animals. To get the project started, AHDB provided the initial funding and an extremely generous offer of support and in-kind sponsorship from Neogen enabled us to finish the job. By the close of 2021, we will have genotyped 30 rams on the leading 600K high density genotype and completed a 50K genotype on the remaining 49.

### **Why did we want to do this?**

Rams come and go, but DNA lives forever. We can't predict the future – but in a genomic age when DNA is giving up many of its secrets it is imperative that we hold a permanent genetic record for these animals.

In the short term, we can use the data to:

- Check parentage (and perhaps grand-parentage)
- Identify major genes that existed amongst founder animals – either beneficial or perhaps deleterious, though I am pleased to say few deleterious ones have arisen over the years.
- Assess genetic diversity amongst founder animals

Longer term this information is vital for a time when the Charollais breed moves to genomic breeding values or for that matter genomic inbreeding values. Seeing the genetic foundation from which the breed has arisen is an important step in understanding where to go next and enabling us to do so more quickly than ever before.

### **What next?**

AHDB is constantly thinking about where genomic information will take us next. At the moment that activity is mostly focused on preserving a genomic record from which other studies can build; in RamCompare for example, all Charollais rams have been genotyped and the data saved. While, we don't have the funds to do it at the moment – it is logical

that in the future we save tissue from lambs of known genetic merit, like those being CT scanned for example.

As breeders, if you have important sires in your semen flask I would strongly suggest that one or two semen straws are retained for future genotyping. If you have living rams, you may also consider collecting tissue samples using some of the modern tissue sampling kits that are available and storing samples behind your frozen peas at home. The cost of tissue sampling and storage is low relative to the value of the information it may hold.

For those interested in genotyping their rams, regardless of your gene test provider, consider whether the money you are investing in one or two individual gene tests could be used to get the same information as part of a low density, 50K genotype – and get another 49,998 bits of information at the same time.

### **Summary**

AHDB is delighted to have had this opportunity to build a

For many years the Society has moved forward as a force to produce a better breed, more suited to the requirements of the market place and we have been very good at achieving that.

Some breeders however find it difficult to work together, for long periods and find it difficult to be loyal. Their allegiances change and move on, usually because what one breeder wants is very often completely different from what the next person wants.

Charollais has been allowed to develop, it would not still be here, if it had not. There is no doubt that within the breed, great changes have taken place. The important ones are structural soundness, faster growth, more muscle, with well-balanced intra muscular fat, prolificacy and the continuation of easy lambing qualities.

However, be careful, in changing some aspects it is also possible to change some elements for the worse. If that is happening, stop it, and certainly do not pass on those inferior qualities to others, especially to new entrants.

Charollais are undoubtedly tougher, it takes a long time to do that within a whole breed. At the same time, there is still variation, which is essential.

As with many breeds in the past, in pigs, cattle and sheep, the show world can do serious damage. The worst of these is to take ones eye off the commercial ball. The leaders and the breeders of the future must make certain this does not go any further.

I have noticed, along with Society in general, there is a much stronger culture of blame now than there was a decade or two

ago. The blamers are not coming up with the solutions. Everybody wants change, there must be change! Change to what? Blind change is not the answer.

When Charollais were introduced to the UK, the taxpayers' financial support to the sheep sector was huge and created a massive wave of positivity that Charollais rode to success on. Over the last 10-20 years the challenges from new genetic mixes of sheep and breeds has presented concern amongst breeders. Actually it has presented many opportunities some of which have been taken on board by a number of us. It is possible that we are entering a new but different type of period of growth and positive returns. There are many challenges to master to achieve this, but it is possible and will be exciting – just always remember Charollais are a great breed.

It is important that the energy that has existed be employed by as many as possible to tell the world just how good Charollais are. More especially now as we are being encouraged to eat less meat because of the increasing

number of mouths that the world is providing us to feed, which is also linked to climate change, diet and more.

The only way in which we can measure how we improve, faster growth etc is by recording information. The Breed Society has supported the concept of breed improvement since it was first set up 40+ years ago. It is difficult for an administration, to enforce this, because the membership is made up of a vast number of different breeders who nearly all are looking for something different from their sheep and their breed. Therefore it is not enforced, but encouraged and the hope that over time (it turns out it's a very long time) more people will come round to it. I am certain that the whole process will speed up now.

Climate change will probably be the biggest driver of this element. Simply faster growing animals leave a far lower carbon footprint, because they are not around so long to leave one! We need information on those sires and dams in order to know how fast the lambs will grow, given the right

management. That information exists because we have been working with MLC, Signet, EBLEX, AHDB from day one. The information is now highly reliable.

I have spent many years on your behalf, promoting the qualities of Charollais to the rest of the world. There is a real demand for our product and very often from big meat production systems. The market is a little difficult at the moment; the aftermath of Brexit and the resulting barriers which need to be brought down. The excitement of new prospective breeders around the world wanting the product you are producing is great and very encouraging. I wish more people could experience that. It is

however hard work and full of potential disappointments.

Fortunately we have lots of the next generation involved in our breed, in lots of different ways. Some are keen to do something and change things. They are already changing things, because they have grown up in a new era with new technologies and they are well equipped to apply them along with the traditional hard work (it doesn't go away) to their breeding, feeding management, promotion, marketing and selling. I encourage you to get your own structures growing. Bare in mind 'babies and bathwater' whilst you are doing this. We have had great people involved with this breed over the whole of its development and there will be new ones as times go on. You are probably one of them! It is about fun as well.

I urge you to get involved with research projects, make certain that Charollais is there and part of them; don't let other breeds take the limelight. Also be part of other organisations, local and national, in order to have a direct influence in what will happen next, don't

I will continue with the Crogham Flock of Charollais, now the oldest in the UK and a number of other farming activities and challenges.

I set out to buy my first Charollais in 2014 – a ram lamb from the NSA sale at Exeter to cover my commercial ewes. Whilst at the sale, a sweet ewe lamb caught my eye and just like that, Saveock Charollais began. In the past 6 years the other members of the South West region have always been encouraging with Amy Pedrick always on hand to answer my questions, as a relative new starter it is a fantastic breed society to be a part of.

I now have 25 breeding ewes and I most definitely could not have got them to where they are now, without the help of my hands-on parents! From showing judges around for the flock competition while I was milking, to staying up until the early hours to help me lamb ewes, nothing has ever been too much.

## Flock Profiles

### Flocks around the UK tell their stories

In 2020, I bought a new stock ram Boyo Vicious Sid. He caught my eye from David Robert's early posts on social media and I was lucky enough to purchase him privately. He is everything I was looking for, correct throughout with a strong head, good bone, and exceptional carcase.

Last year was my most successful to date selling 7 rams in total, a fantastic boost following a mediocre lambing. Lambing 2020 was much better albeit I had almost 70% ram lambs! A change of feed made all the difference, but every year is such a learning curve and I believe you can never stop improving. I now formulate my own pre and post lambing ration and am chuffed that it has worked so well so far.

My favourite ewe line goes back to a ewe I bought in 2017 from the Rockvilla flock. She was in lamb to Logie Durno Lotus and produced a ewe that is pointed out every year in the flock competition. I want to improve my ewes; this will entail being more selective and demoting those that do not make the cut to the commercial flock – what a fall from grace! My advice to anyone starting out in Pedigree Charollais is firstly, learn to be a dab hand with a crook – they are always stronger and faster than you think! Secondly, you do not have to spend top money to produce good stock. Have a good eye for what you like and if you are improving each year you will get there.

The Rowanston Charollais flock was founded in 1984, when my brother James and I persuaded my father to go with us to the inaugural breed sale at Lockerbie market. So impressed were we with the carcass qualities of the sheep, that we purchased the top price shearling ram and ewe lamb from the Neills flock at Castle Douglas both for 720gns. The shearling was successfully used over our Scotch Mule flock producing easily lambbed carcass lambs selling for a premium over the Suffolk crosses of the time.

Over the years we increased our commercial flock to over 2,000 breeding ewes, with almost all prime lambs sired by homebred Charollais rams.

We now sell 15–20 grass fed shearlings off farm every year. We have always focused on the commercial aspects of the breed as all our prime lambs are sold deadweight through Farmstock marketing group. On several occasions we have won the trophy for highest percentage of in-spec lambs sold throughout the season, an achievement which gives us great satisfaction. We like Charollais as they suit our system from early born creep-fed lambs, to late season hogs from hill ewes. When selecting a stock tup we look for good carcasses with hard fleshing qualities and tight skins. We like tups to have a clean head although not bare, as this leaves a good stamp on the lambs. We look at figures but would never select on figures alone.


Recent stock tups Tymaen Poundstretcher and Wedderburn Stan The Man have bred exceptionally well for us, and we have lambs on the ground from Logie Durno Ultimatum purchased at Worcester 2019 for 5,500gns in partnership with the Loaningfoot flock. By using some homebred sires in the flock too, we feel it helps us to fix the type we are trying to breed.

Having previously bred Charollais in the 1980's, I started again in 2017 after downsizing my arable operation, as Charollais always remained an interest of mine. I was originally attracted to the breed during a college trip to the Charolles region in 1978. My flock is named after the farm, Runningburn, located in Stichill, Kelso. I restarted my flock buying a gimmer and ewe from Alan and Herbie Kennedy's Parkgate flock dispersal in 2017 and most recent female purchases were bought at High Flyers Sale in Hereford in Autumn 2019. I look for good families, ewes with characters and skins, whilst in stock tups I look for power, good legs and feet, with tight skin and flesh. My aim has been to always breed correct, fleshy, good skinned sheep. My sister and niece, Helen and Hannah Sloan, have inspired me to start the flock again.

I sold rams at Kelso ram sale in 2019 for the first time, noting a lot were sold to Lleyne ewe breeders. I ventured to the Worcester Premier Sale for the first time in 2020, with progeny of the ewes purchased at the Hereford High Flyers Sale.

Charollais breeders are extremely friendly helpful people and it is great to see some of the breeders I knew from my original involvement with the breed still going strong."

up half of our ewes today. More ewes were purchased from the Gwyndy flock and nine ewes from Foulrice flock over the following years.

Our farm is based in Waberthwaite, a village on the west coast of Cumbria. At the end of our field is a small plantation, Smithy Wood, and so the name was chosen. Our ethos is “if it doesn’t grow, it goes” it’s the motto I use first in deciding if lambs are retained. If they have good natural grow rates, then I look at all the other points before retaining only the best. I believe as a breed, growth is our biggest asset over other terminal sires.

Our tups are sold commercial at local auctions, mainly Ulverston and Kendal. The ram I have mainly used for the last two years is Uranium, a lamb born here from a Foulrice ewe purchased in lamb to Sheldon Supreme.

Our aim for the next few years is to up ewe numbers from 53 to about 90. Charollais fit in well on our small farm as both myself and my wife work full time and they are an easy breed to look after and suit our heavy ground and the heavy rainfall. My advice to new breeders would be keep it simple to start with, purchase some good foundation ewes and ask questions. As a society, our members are very helpful.


